

Prof Wing-Ho Yung is currently a chair professor in the Department of Neuroscience, City University of Hong Kong. Before taking up the position in City University, he had served in the School of Biomedical Sciences, Faculty of Medicine, at the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), and as the founding director of the Gerald Choa Neuroscience Centre at CUHK. He was a recipient of the Commonwealth Scholarship and the Croucher Foundation Fellowship that supported his DPhil study and post-doctoral training in the University of Oxford, under the supervision of Prof. Julian Jack, FRS. Prof Yung has broad research interests in understanding the functions and mechanisms of the nervous system and its malfunctions through employing a multitude of cutting-edge neuroscience and computational techniques. In past decades, he has been active in promoting neuroscience in the region by serving as a member of the Asian-Pacific Regional Committee of the International Brain Research Organization (IBRO) and as the secretary general of the Federation of the Asian-Oceanian Neuroscience Societies.
